

Why we need money

since its foundation by a group of philanthropic businessmen, the charity has been able to maintain and improve its accommodation through the years owing to the generosity of local benefactors.

The residents make a contribution to the upkeep of the homes, but the charity depends on the income from its carefully managed funds, to keep this at an affordable level, while at the same time maintaining the fabric of the listed properties and bringing them up to the ever-demanding statutory standards required today. It is a fact that older listed buildings are proportionately more expensive to modernise and upgrade than more recent buildings and, without generous donations, the Homes would struggle to continuously update their facilities.

It is hard to believe that as recently as 1967, the Homes had just one central bath in the Warden's house. Due to generous Legacies in the past, each home does now have its own bathroom! But with an ageing population, and the desire to help residents to lead independent lives in their own homes for as long as possible, further amenities such as level-access showers will have to be provided in the future.
